### DESCRIPTION and MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

An ASE appointed as a Teaching Assistant is assigned responsibilities for the term of the appointment that may include, but are not limited to the following duties: attending the assigned course, conducting section meetings, holding regular office hours, reading and grading student papers, homework, and examinations, drafting narrative evaluations in a timely manner, etc. Specific responsibilities for individual courses are available from the instructor.

The minimum eligibility qualifications for an ASE assigned as a Teaching Assistant are: registered UCSC graduate student at the time of employment and good academic standing.

### **EXCEPTIONS**

Exceptions to the minimum eligibility qualifications for each position may be made at the sole discretion of the University.
